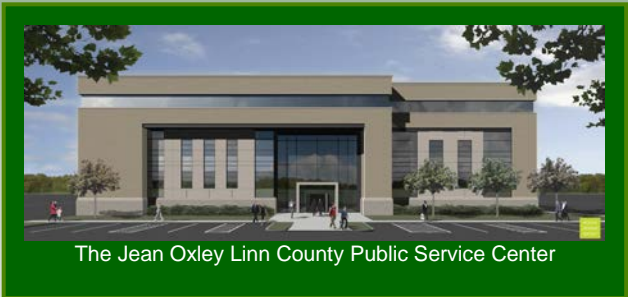

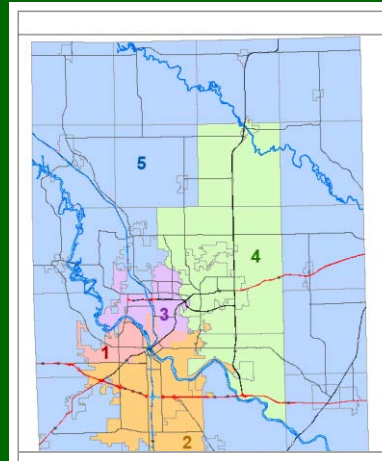

- ★ Organized as a county in the Iowa Territory in 1839
- ★ Second most populous county in Iowa (216,111 Census estimate)
- ★ 726 square miles
- ★ 18 cities and 8 unincorporated communities
- ★ Linn County maintains 1,200 miles of secondary roads
- ★ Linn County Public Health is the first county health department in Iowa to earn national accreditation

Linn County Public Services

Efficient and effective ... Linn County works hard to ensure the best quality of life for its residents.

1 • Human Services

Mental health & developmental disability services; low income & senior assistance; home care aides; child development; para-transit; youth services

2 • Public Safety

The Sheriff's Office oversees the jail, provides law enforcement, patrol services, investigates crimes and operates emergency dispatch & paramedic rescue

3 • Treasurer

Collects & distributes property taxes for the county and other taxing entities (e.g., cities, school districts); issues vehicle titles, registration & license plates

4 • Vital Records

Records real estate documents, marriage licenses, birth and death certificates; registers boats & ATVs; hunting/fishing licenses; passports

5 • Elections

Oversee federal, state, county & local elections

6 • Public Health Department

Disease prevention; immunizations; restaurant inspections; air quality monitoring; promotes healthy lifestyles; emergency preparedness

7 • Roads & Transportation

Maintain 1,200 miles of county roads & bridges

8 • Planning and Development

Building codes, inspections, permits; rural land use plan; zoning; flood plain management

9 • Veteran Affairs

Help eligible veterans apply for VA benefits; provides financial assistance; food pantry

10 • Conservation Department

28 areas with 7,000+ acres of parks & natural areas; Wickiup Hill Learning Center; Eastern Iowa Observatory & Learning Center
