The park is divided into  
three basic use zones:

## Recreational Day Use

### Facilities include:

- Picnic shelter
- Playground
- Horseshoe court
- Trails - 4 miles of all-purpose trails
- Winter cross-country ski trails:
  - 3 miles of groomed trails when snow conditions allow, suitable for classic or skate skiing
- Open sports field
- 2 baseball backstops
- 7 picnic sites with pedestal stoves



### Morgan Creek Shelter | 7001 Morgan Park Rd., Palo

- 10 picnic tables
- 4 grills
- Shelter available for rental between April 15 – October 15
- Horseshoe court
- 4 electric outlets (fee required)

## Camping

**FAMILY CAMPGROUND** | The entrance to the campground is 7287 Worcester Rd., Palo. The normal camping season is April 15 - October 15 and all sites are first come-first served.

### There are 36 surfaced campsites:

- All sites are handicapped accessible
- Electric service: 20, 30 & 50-amp
- Fire ring with grill
- Picnic table
- Water hookup

### Other facilities:

- Modern restroom/showers
- Firewood available for nominal fee
- Trails to day-use area and arboretum
- Dump station

**GROUP CAMPGROUND** | A “pack-in” group campground (reservation only) is located at 7011 Morgan Park Rd., Palo. A short walk is required to reach the campground. Capacity is 15 tents or 45 people.

**Morgan Creek Park** is located just west of the Cedar Rapids city limits in Linn County, Iowa providing a wide variety of natural and recreational features within this 352-acre area. Steep wooded hills in the east and gently rolling hills in the west combine with the stream valley of Morgan Creek. Over 4 miles of trails allow you to explore every corner of the park throughout the year. Enjoy the bluebells in spring, the summer prairie flowers, fall colors in the arboretum and cross-country skiing in the winter.

The entrance to the Morgan Creek Arboretum is 7439 Worcester Rd., Palo. A one mile crushed limestone trail loops and winds through over 250 species of trees and shrubs. The plant collections include:

- Native and exotic shade trees
- Crabapples
- Ornamental trees and shrubs
- Lilacs
- Prairie grasses and forbs
- Butterfly Garden
